# **Work Schedule**

This position is employed 194 working days per school year. The traditional school calendar extends from August through early June.

### **General Duties**

- Supervise and Evaluate Athletic Staff and Coaches
- Develop and implement specific athletic programs; direct and coordinate a full range of athletic department services and programs. Ensure compliance with CIF-SS and appropriate correspondence.
- Provide athlete and coach orientations, physical conditioning, and training programs. Ensure all coaching staff adheres to the CSDR/CIF required training courses annually.
- Supervise utilization of the athletic facilities and staff; coordinate athletic uses of training and weight room facilities; recommend and review policies for student and community use of facilities; review and recommend changes, repairs and improvement of athletic equipment and facilities.
- Coordinate Title IX (student); ensure to comply with its obligations under Title IX and the regulations.
- Monitor eligibility between the High School Administration team, Student Life, athletes, and coaches for all teams.
- Oversee the coordination of vehicles, meals, lodgings, medication, team rosters for athletics travel.
- Provide leadership for C- Booster and other athletics club fundraising activities.
- Attend all athletic home events/competitions and be the game administrator.
- Serve as liaison with community, state and conference organizations related to athletics.
- Provide end-of-year Sports Awards. Keep records of all awards/letters issued
- Review necessary eligibility and CIF transfer forms. Assist the coaches and athletes with regards to compliance of CIF-SS regulations regarding roster, eligibility, pictures, etc.
- Adhere to progressive discipline guidance, do student interviews if violated.

- Fluency in expressive and receptive American Sign Language (ASL) of at least a Level 4
   ASLPI is required (evaluated through interview process)
- Fluent communication in standard written English
- Possession of a master's degree or higher in Deaf Education from a regionally accredited college or university
- Minimum of five years' experience as a classroom teacher
- Possess or be eligible to apply for a California Education Specialist Instruction credential with an authorization in Deaf & Hard-of-hearing
- Possess, or be eligible to apply for, a California Administrative Services Credential
