Work Schedule

This position is employed 184 working days per school year. The traditional school calendar extends from August through early June.

General Duties

Plan and design standards – based instructional activities that build student competence in reading, writing and arithmetic. Design appropriate assessments that gauge student mastery of California English-Language Arts and other content area standards. Prepare reports, lesson plans, IEP's and establish evaluation techniques for assessment of progress and maintain accurate and timely records of student progress, and able to work effectively with a wide range of students. Use Universal Design for Learning and adapt instruction to meet students needs in both the California Common Core standards as well as the California Alternate Curriculum standards.

Basic Requirements

- Fluency in expressive and receptive American Sign Language (ASL) of at least a Level 4 ASLPI is required (evaluated through interview process)
- Fluent communication in standard written English
- Academic Teacher: Possession of a Bachelor's Degree (BA/BS)
- Passage of the Basic Skills Requirement / CBEST or equivalent.
- Valid California credential(s) authorizing service for the position in which employed.
- Possess or be eligible to apply a California Education Specialist Instruction credential with an authorization in Deaf & Hard-of-hearing.

NOTE – a Bachelor's Degree may be either a Bachelor of Arts or a Bachelor of Science. Credentials must be approved by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing. Qualified applicants who do not meet the credential requirements at the time of hire, may be given up to one year to obtain their credential(s).
