General Duties

Maintain consistent and clear communication at all times in ASL. Serve as Administrative Designee for all IEP meetings of assigned case load outside IEP week and as assigned during IEP week. Assist with coordination of testing and act as proctor as required. Assist Principals and behavior teachers with incident investigations. Monitor grade books in reference to student attendance and school grading policies. Monitor Homeroom period. Assist in the review of all High School Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) and all High School grade books. Serve as a liaison in coordination of effective use of the services of CSDR staff (speech teachers, counselors, social workers and behavior specialists) in the implementation of student IEP's or other requirements and programs. Implement the High School Educational Advisor program including guidance, attendance and related areas. Review files and advise Principal about incoming students and attend Admissions Review Team meetings. Review new student's IEPs and transcripts to determine class placements and class schedules. Assist with the organization of statewide testing for students. Assist students with understanding and meeting standard requirements, including, but not limited to: assist students with developing a four-year educational plan; assist students with developing an action plan for meeting academic goals in relation to graduation and career/college choices; conduct and participate in conferences with teachers, students, parents and support services staff to aid in the resolution of academic issues; refer students to various resources on campus as required; review student grade reports to monitor GPAs and academic performance; meet with students as needed.

Basic Requirements

- Fluency in expressive and receptive American Sign Language (ASL) of at least a Level 4
 ASLPI is required (evaluated through interview process)
- Fluent communication in standard written English
- Academic Teacher: Possession of a Bachelor's Degree (BA/BS)
- Possess or be eligible to apply for a California Education Specialist Instruction credential with an authorization in Deaf & Hard-of-hearing.

NOTE – a Bachelor's Degree may be either a Bachelor of Arts or a Bachelor of Science. Credentials must be approved by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing. Qualified applicants who do not meet the credential requirements at the time of hire, may be given up to one year to obtain their credential(s).
