## **Work Schedule**

#### **General Duties**

Plan and implement standards-based instructional activities in Physical Education that promote student development in physical fitness, motor skills, teamwork, and lifelong wellness. Design appropriate assessments to measure student progress aligned with California content standards. Maintain accurate and timely records of student performance, IEP goals, and instructional plans. Collaborate with colleagues, support staff, and families to ensure student success, while maintaining a structured and supportive classroom environment. Provide consistent supervision in all learning and common areas and demonstrate the ability to work effectively with diverse learners in both English and American Sign Language.

## **Required Qualifications**

- Fluency in expressive and receptive American Sign Language (ASL) of at least a Level 4
   ASLPI is required (evaluated through interview process)
- Fluent communication in standard written English
- Academic Teacher: Possession of a Bachelor's Degree (BA/BS)
- Possess or be eligible to apply for a California Education Specialist Instruction credential with an authorization in Deaf & Hard-of-hearing.

NOTE – a Bachelor's Degree may be either a Bachelor of Arts or a Bachelor of Science. Credentials must be approved by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing. Qualified applicants who do not meet the credential requirements at the time of hire, must meet the requirements for an emergency permit.
