General Duties

Under the supervision of the Director of Student Services, the Admissions Coordinator receives and processes student applications for admission to CSDR. General duties include:

- Receive and process all student applications for admissions to CSDR.
- Assist with maintenance and entries in the Student Information System.
- Schedule and facilitate intake meetings to begin the 60-day assessment review period.
- Collaborate with staff members serving students during the 60-day assessment review period.
- Schedule IEP meetings and communicate with all members of the IEP team.
- Establish and maintain positive, professional relationships with LEA and SELPA representatives.
- Respond to inquiries about admissions and programming at CSDR.
- Meet with parents on campus tours to explain the admissions process.
- Facilitate and lead school site visits to observe prospective students.
- Assist with all mandated State and Federal reporting.
- Assume the lead position in the planning of the school-wide IEP Day for new students in October.
- Assist the IEP Coordinator with the coordination of the school-wide IEP Days.
- Collaborate with assessment staff to ensure compliance with state and federal timelines for assessment of students during their 60-day assessment review period.

Required Qualifications

- Fluency in expressive and receptive American Sign Language (ASL) of at least a Level 4 ASLPI is required (evaluated through interview process)
- Fluent communication in standard written English
- Possess a master's degree in school psychology or education-related field.
- Possess a Clear California Education Specialist Instruction Credential with a specialization in Deaf/Hard-of-Hearing OR Clear California Pupil Personnel Services credential.
